Sumpter Co. Ga.

Is not entitled to Cherokee
privileges & the land claimed
by her son by Parris was
improved part by white people
& part by her Negro husband
Fed

Widow Squirrel

4 miles below New Echota &
Near Parkers Rejected because
no place of hers could be
found except the one where
she formerly lived - which
had been valued

Ko-ma-da-nee

at the mouth of the Ooth
- Co-loga Caff Co.

Rejected. No such place
being found. The place
supposed to be it was valued
to Coosa. was in part & in part
to Gally.

John Love

a place 2 miles from
Elijay was sold by Louis to
Dave Rob by him to Ben
Cooper by him, emigrated.

Martin D. Clark

Red Hill Marshall Co
Alabama

The improvement
claimed by this man was evidently
made by a white man &
combination entered into for
him & Clark to divide the money

James Garden here

A Ferry on Tennessee
river above Pop Landing we
are of opinion that this ferry
if it can be called one is
of no value having no net
income

William R. Bear
Marshall Co. Ala.
was married ~~to a Native~~
to a Native since the treaty
& purchased of a white man
the place he claims
therefore clearly rejected

Nelson Ore
Marshall Co. Ala.
the place claimed by Ore
was sold by his father 5 or 6
year ago & before Nelson came
came of age to Absalom
Hillman

Betsy Downing, wife of
John Elliot Deceased
claiming a ferry on Tennessee
River if she is entitled to one
we could not ascertain that it
was of any value

D. J. Bell
Claims a place in Wells
Valley we learn from his
father that the improvement
was made by a white man
& that D. J. Bell had intended
to improve the same place
if the white man had not
prevented him

Sub
Claims a place in
Murray County which
has been valued to Charles
McDaniel

John G. Rop

Claims a ferry on Tennessee
river from information
got on the spot we think it
of no value

June 22nd

From additional
evidence in this case it
appears that Rop obtained
from the Major a permit

to open a road & made
the ferry called Ridge's ferry
on Tennessee river in or
about 1810 that he gave
the white man who owned
the north bank the use of
his part rent free the first
year for furnishing the
boat since which he
has never attended to it

This is his own version
of the matter

10 Thomas, William and
James Davis

By their att^o M^o William
claim the valuation of a
place near Deposit on ⁱⁿ ~~in~~

Their father Emigrated
some years ago had this
place valued

Rider Fields

applied for the valuation of
a place near the mouth of
Flint Marshall C^o Ala

the improvement was made
by white people who were
burned out Fields

Took possession & cultivated
it one year & then left it
long since we declined
valuing it

Fields also applied for
the valuation of a place
near the last abandoned
by his father 15 years ago
declined also

Joseph B. Collins

applied for 2 valuations
in Forsyth C^o Ga
but failed to prove his
claim to our satisfaction
he referred us to M^o Rodgers
who thinks Collins has no
claim to the places

James McTier
applied through David Vann
for the valuation of a Cabin
in Vanns Valley. On examination
we find it was valued &
registered heretofore.

Raincrow
applied by David Vann
for the valuations of a small
field in Vanns Valley on
visiting it we find an old
grown up briar patch

Old Mrs. Su-we-killer
applied by Tom Su-we-killer
for the valuation of an impro-
vement made by her deceased
husband on Chatuga River
Floyd Co. Ga. we find an
old abandoned place overgrown
with briars.

Tom Su-we-killer
applied for 2 valuations on
Chatuga, the one in Cleghorn
field we valued & the other
opposite had been valued
last fall

George Downing
 claims a valuation at Chestnut,
 old town - this place was
 abandoned many years ago

Tsu-qua-ty-go
 applied through Mr. Rolliff
 for a valuation 8 miles above
 Turkey town H^o. of 6 acres
 a cabin & a camp.
 It has been valued to the
 widow it ail we believe
 it never did belong to the
 applicant

Cheah-Mo-Nah wife of
 John Rolliff by M^r. Williams
 applied for a valuation of an
 improvement made by her
 father whooping bog on Mills
 creek H^o.

8 acres of which was emigrated
 by Silas Schote some years ago
 & the balance valued to
 John G. Ross by Rice & McLooy

Daniel Mills
 applied by Henry Sutton for
 2 valuations on Coosa river
 they have both been valued
 to the proper owners. Galt
 Lavender represents Mills as
 not entitled to credit

claims a valuation near
the Chauga camp ground
Cherokee Co Ala which was
sold to McNulty & valued to
& emigrated by Wilson

He also applied for the
place where Booker lives
near Gaylesville this place
was valued to McIntosh
& emigrated

in Cherokee Co Ala near the above
which was sold 5 or 6 years
ago & valued to Griffin

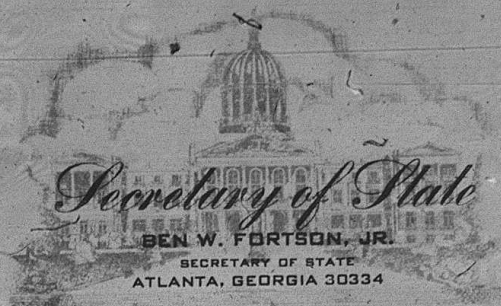
