



### **Bazely Taylor**

**Another family from Indian Creek, Basil Taylor (or “Bazele”) and his wife Elizabeth Hayes raised five boys and two girls. The boys were Chesley T, Isaac Joshua, Barzela, Henry R, and Richard. His daughters were Lucinda and Elizabeth.**

**Basil was a private in the Union army in a regiment that primarily was used in the Middle Tennessee area to chase and dispatch rebel guerrillas.**

**Indian Creek must have gotten crowded by the middle of the century, because Bazely moved his family to Temperance Hall. His father, David Jacob Taylor was living in Indian Creek by 1830 as his first child, Sarah Elizabeth, was born there in 1831.**

**Bazele married Elizabeth Hayes March 23, 1858, in Dekalb County. He married a second wife, Frances Melvina Hendrixson, December 14, 1873, also in Dekalb County.**

**Basil Taylor was disinterred from Claud Walker cemetery and relocated to Mt Holly. His daughter, Mrs Dave Taylor was present at the disinterment.**
