

## **Edmond C Walker**

Edmond C Walker (1832-1897) was the son of Samuel Walker (1804-1868) and Mary Elizabeth Nixon (1805-1886). He married Nancy, whose maiden name is unknown. She was born May 25, 1830 and died July 5, 1901. She was the mother of eight children: John (1848), Samuel (1850), Monroe (1852), Hannah (1853), Alexander (1856), Martha (1858), Gilbert (1860), and Margaret (1861).

Edmond fought for the Union in the Civil War in Company E, 4<sup>th</sup> Tennessee Mounted Infantry. While he was in the military he was kicked by a horse, which caused him quite a lot of pain and suffering. The year he died his wife Nancy applied for his pension. The pension application identified her as Nancy "M" Walker. By this time she was no longer his wife, for on July 16, 1879 he married his second wife Matilda Page (1833-?). She bore him no children.

His stone states "An honest man, the noblest work of God."

He was removed from K C Tramel cemetery and relocated to Mt Holly. Noone was present.
