

Frances Herald

Frances Herald was born in 1871 in Tennessee. She is recorded as being nine years old on the 1880 Federal Census. She is listed as a member of the household of James Herald (1835-after 1910) and Nancy Medley ((1837-before 1910). Both James and Nancy were born in Jackson County, Tennessee. They married in 1854.

When Civil War came James Herald went to Clarke County, Indiana and joined the 10th Indiana Cavalry, in which he served from December 30, 1863 until September 9, 1865. When he left for military duty he only had Martha (1857) and Vina (1862).

His name appears on the 1890 soldiers questionaire, and again on his application for a pension. Both documents state that he fought in the 10th Indiana Cavalry. On the units muster roll he is listed as James "Herrel" of Clarke County, Indiana.

Frances disappears after the 1880 census and does not appear again.

Frances should not be confused with the wife of her brother, William Herald, of DeKalb Co., TN. He appeared in the 1900 census and had married Mary Frances "Fannie" Glover, daughter of Ben Glover, of Putnam Co., TN. His wife was buried in Maynard Cemetery, and her removal was not recorded- all according to her death certificate. This William was the brother of the Frances Herald in this Mount Holly Cemetery grave.

She was interred at D T Puckett cemetery and later disinterred and relocated at Mt Holly. Noone was listed as being present at her disinterment.
