



Macy Clemons

Macy Clemons was born Nov. 22, 1909 and died June 16, 1927. She was a daughter of Charlie (March 13, 1878-1954) and Minnie Clemons (May 18, 1892-June 1974). Charlie was blind in his right eye.

Charlie and Minnie were from Silver Point in Dekalb County, Tennessee. They were married in Putnam County, Tennessee on December 23, 1908.

Charlie was born in a year that made him eligible for the draft in both WWI and WWII. He registered for WWI in Dekalb County, Tennessee on September 12, 1918, and for WWII in September, 1942 in Peru, Miami County, Indiana where he and Minnie had went to find employment. Minnie died there in 1974, twenty years after Charlie.

Charlie came home to Dekalb County, Tennessee and was buried there, at a location now unknown. He was disinterred and relocated at Mt Holly cemetery. Noone was present at his disinterment.

Macy Clemons was their first born child (1909). The year she was born her grandfather John H Clemons celebrated his 100th birthday.

Macy's siblings were: Cora (1912), Woodrow (1917), Eskel (1918), Irene (1920), Maggie (1927), Vinnie (1928) and Marion (1930).

Macy Clemons was buried at an unknown location and was disinterred and relocated at Mt Holly cemetery. Noone was listed as being present at her disinterment.
