

Watkins Lee Foster

Watkins Lee Foster was born October 9, 1832 and died May 20, 1920. He was a son of Eppsolum Foster (1787-1864) and Sarah R Vasser (1797-1843). He was born and died at Silver Point in Dekalb County, Tennesssee.

On June 17, 1866 he married Susan Prudence Alsup, daughter of Hyrum Alsup (1809-1855) and Morning Alsup (1819-1871). She was born February 13, 1831 in Wilson County, Tennessee and died March 13, 1925 at Silver Point, Dekalb County, Tennessee.

Watkins and Susan Foster had these children: Samuel (1867), William Clayburn (1867), Elijah Alsup (1869), Robert Lee (1871), Eppes (1873), John (1874), Samuel Nelson (1876) and George Hiram (1878).

Watkins fought in the Civil War for the Confederacy in A Company, 1st Battalion (Colm's) Tennessee Infantry.

He was buried at Moss Generation Cemetery and later was disinterred and relocated at Mt Holly Cemetery. His granddaughter, Mrs Jewel Walker, was present at the disinterment
