


USGS TOPO MAPS — 1890s - Early 1900s

Notes:

- There is also a Greenbrier map that covers the same area as the Nashville map.
- The Murfreesboro map is mis-labeled as Holly Springs on at least one of the adjacent topos.
- The Murfreesboro, Tompkinsville, and Pall Mall maps are identified on adjacent topos, but may have never been produced.



These maps show rivers before impoundment by dams, streams and creeks, cities and towns, houses and buildings (but no owner names), railroads, old roadways, trails and ferries, benchmarks and triangulation stations, mines, and land contours (elevation).

Each Map Covers 1/2 degree (30 min.) East-West (approx. 30 mi.) and North-South (approx. 38 mi.). They cover 16 times the area of current 7.5 minute topos, and as a result have less detail.
