

Churches of No Business and Station Camp

No Business Community had two churches. One a Separate Baptist Church organized in 1871 and moved to Black Oak about 1930. Jacob Roysden was the Pastor.

The second church was a United Baptist Church organized in November 1898 by Isham R. Roysden, A. M Gregory and Hiram Watson, Sr. This church survived until 1952 when everyone had moved away. They had received 206 members. Rev. James Miller, brother of France Miller, was pastor of the church. They helped organize Rock Creek Church and Laurel Hill Church in Kentucky and Grave Hill Church in Tennessee.

The New Zion United Baptist Church at Station Camp was organized in 1868 and is yet going. It is 140 years old. It was moved to Alticrest Community in Fentress County, TN in 1964 when everyone had moved away from Station Camp.
