



Mr. John George Bayer, one of the oldest men of this community, died at the home of his son, Joe Bayer, Saturday evening at nine o'clock, Oct. 7. He was born at Bremen, Germany in 1822, being 83 years and 6 months He joined the church at the age of 12, and lived a devout and true Christian to the end of his life. He came to New York at the age of 22, and later settled in Pennsylvania, where he met his first loved. After her premature death he married a second time, and with his wife moved to this place in 1870. He was a good citizen, a faithful husband and loving father. His family consists of six sons and three daughters, all of which show by their present position in life and church that their father and mother possessed parental abilities beyond the average. His long life also proves to us that a life of righteousness is longer and much more beneficial to the world than a life of sin. God help us to profit by his example.
