

DEPOSITION *K*

Case of *William Hensley, I.O., No. 253 030*

On this *9th* day of *October*, 1905, at *Stiggins Creek*, County of *Union* State of *Tenn.*, before me, *Henry B. Hazard* a special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared *Joseph Harris*, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: I am *64* years of age; my post-office address is *Flagford, Tenn.* occupation, *farmer and miller.*

1 I served during the civil war in *Kirk's 3rd N.C.*
2 *mntd Inf., U.S.A.* but don't remember my company
3 I served all of *3 months.* I don't remember the year I
4 joined.

5 I enlisted in *Madison, N.C.*
6 I went on scouts with *Kirk's men,* one from *Shelton*
7 *Lanard, N.C.* across the *Smoky Mtns.* into *Tennessee.*
8 We was on our raid across through *Edgefield* in *North*
9 *Carolina.*

10 I was with *Kirk* when he fought the *whirl home*
11 *guard* about *Flagford, Tenn.*

12 I don't recollect going over to *Clearhanch, Tenn.*
13 to *W. E. Folsom's* war raid. If I was I have forgotten
14 it.

15 I am sure *Wm. Hensley* was with me and he
16 was one of *Kirk's men.* I don't remember whether he
17 belonged to my company or not and I have forgotten
18 the name of my company.

19 *William Hensley* was with me part of the time,
20 most of the time I was with *Kirk.* but can't state the
21 number of days weeks or months.

22 I don't know as to *Wm. Hensley* being with any
23 other company or regiment during the civil war.
24 I am not a pensioner or applicant.
